## **NSF TRAVEL GRANT FOR JUNIOR FACULTY AND POST-DOCTORAL FELLOWS**

In an effort to increase the participation of women and underrepresented groups in the EMI conference, National Science Foundation will provide a number of travel assistantships to postdoctoral researchers and junior faculty members from those groups.

### **Eligibility**

Applicants must be junior faculty members within the first three years of their tenure track appointment or post-doctoral researchers in one of the Institutions in the United States. The awardees will be selected from the pool of eligible applicants in such a way that the diversity of the participants is ensured. Preference will be given to first time EMI conference attendees.

### **Requirements**

All awardees will be required to attend the NSF-supported panel session on “Fostering Engineering Mechanics Research Community Diversity and Inclusion” and provide a one-page written feedback on their take from the panel discussions along with their suggestions for fostering diversity and inclusion within the engineering mechanics community.
